From the Desk of *Secretary*



Our Organization JSK is very much pleased to present the 16th Annual Report for the year 2018-19. Its efforts were centralized towards the betterment of the target community and society. I would like to share some experiences and achievement before you. I would be very happy to get feedback and suggestions from you so that I can apply in the field with community in future course of action.

2018-2019 annual report sets out its achievements and the challenges faced during the year and at another, it is a narrative of JSK's journey in empowering and ensuring well-being of our target community.

JSK's work is in the field of education, livelihood, health, environmental conservation, water and sanitation including SBM activities, building community institutions and youths empowerment through organizing games and sports with providing needful requirements.

The programmes in this period 2018-2019 continued to serve the communities. Children who had not a chance to go to regular school were given opportunities to overcome these gaps. More than 20% of students reached high school level. What is troubling is that the government's educational system continues to provide substandard education and does not reaffirm children's desire to continue their studies.

The journey has made and is still making, in all its 8 districts, 27 blocks and 315 revenue villages. Its different programmes, while seemingly discrete, add up to provide opportunities and strength to enable citizens to deepen self-governance. As you read through the report, you will see how this is happening. There are villages where communities have opted different livelihood alternatives and initiated to change economic well-being. These villages have been mainstreamed in the development processes.

Gender discrimination, education, health related issues have been addressed by these communities in the year with the support of JSK. Though a lot of effort need to go, there are significant improvements in children's learning levels, health status, immunization cover, women's status, better drinking water and sanitation status along with improved natural resources. All this has been possible with the support of past and present donors, friends, staffs, volunteers, board members and partner communities who have maintained their trust in the immense work.

We take this opportunity to thank them all and to seek their support in the future also. We do hope that JSK's experience on the ground will be able to continue the different programmes in 2019-2020 also with the support from the community and support agencies.

Once again I would like to thank all persons, Funding Agencies, Govt administration, individuals, consultants members of executive body, staffs and other related stakeholders who have given cooperation in translating the work in the field.

Work Processes and Approach

The organization has adapted to balance the social action, mobilization and sustainable development program in order to ensure a just society, educated, egalitarian and non-exploitative society. JSK mobilized the rural community and empowered them for development aimed at justice, economic growth and self-reliance on the basis of equality.

In this process, the organisation works in the remotest and tribal areas of Jharkhand, where still the lights of Government development is far in a true sense. The inhabitants are either unaware of the schemes and development programmes of the Government or these programmes and schemes are hardly reaching to them. Deprivation, poverty, exploitation and marginalisation are features of these areas. Gender-based inequalities, inequalities and violence are also shades of these geographies. With all odds surrounding, the tribal areas have certain even feature as well, they're culturally bonding, knowledge of forest and forest product, traditional knowledge of framing and land conservation etc.

As an approach, the organisation, at first, tries to understand the grassroots' realities in relation to various issues and works with locals on the strategy to work on the identified issues. Though the organisation key thrust area on livelihood enhancement by improving local agricultural alternatives, the organisation also works on the issues related to women empowerment, gender-based violence, education, health and nutrition issues. As the organisation receives support in one or other issues for geography, however, the organisation focuses on integrated development approach in the project area.

Key Interventions and overview

A. Livelihoods and Economic Development

1. Construction of Water Harvesting Structures

Livelihood is the fundamental need of any person or living being for its survival. With the needs of livelihood among deprived sections, tribal's and marginal farmer's socially and economically backward community, JSK has been implementing different livelihood initiatives in its project areas which are as under.

Under Natural Resource management organization has constructed water tank, ponds, wells, and follow up done regularly.

JSK has executed the water harvesting structures at Gomia Block of Bokaro district getting financial support from Welfare dept. Bokaro ensuring community participation and contribution. Cumulative achievements can be seen in the above table. Now beneficiaries are using the infrastructures made by the project. Fishery activity has been initiating. Duck rearing activities are also being initiated. Almost 20-25% gross annual income of family has been increased due to assets created through the project.

Apart from water harvesting structures, JSK has supported around 300 tribal HH in the remotest villages of Gomia. Under these interventions and with the help of community participation, we supported in the development of water harvesting structures. With the help of Department of Rural Development, Government of Jharkhand, we provided communities with diesel and electric pumps, which are helpful in increasing the irrigation coverage. JSK also facilitated to the formation of Pani Panchayat at the village level, which are responsible for the management and monitoring of these developed assets at the field level. Follow up activities were done regularly in Mandu block of Ramgarh district, Tati Jhariya and Bishnugarh blocks of Hazaribag district.

2. Promotion of Lac Cultivation at Mandu Ramgarh District

Organization has promoted Lac cultivation among 100 tribal farmers at Mandu block covering 6 villages namely Chapra, Adla, Harli, Mayurnachwa, Chapri and Sisamo. Lac seeds training and medicinal support, exposure visits were provided to 100 farmers. They did cultivation in Palas ber and kusum tree. Rangini lac and kusumi lac seeds were provided in the month of January and June, Approx 10-12 thousand additional income was increased to each farmers.

3. Improved Agriculture Promotion among small and marginal farmers in tribal areas

During the year, JSK has executed improved agriculture promotion in Tatijharia, Bishnugarh and Gomiya blocks with financial support from NBJK-BFW. A total number of 450 farmers were supported from the project. During the year additional 100 farmers were included for doing cash crop promotion through revolving fund generation Project initiated in the year 2013 and continued in 2018-2019 which is totally based on ensuring the food security and protection from the problem of starvation of poor tribals.

Right to Food with livelihoods had been implemented as an intensive program wherein it identifies poorest of the poor farmers and provides training in modern farming techniques and other farming support including capital and handholding support and monitoring during the farming cycle to help them break the poverty cycle and come out of the clutches of local moneylenders.

JSK's agriculture programme includes a range of activities designed to improve crop production by strengthening local community seed banks, increase horticulture, improve livestock, health and promote organic farming. These activities help to rejuvenate the land and water resources and crop development activities for increase the productivity of the local field crops. 450 farmers were selected to plant rice, fruits and vegetables. Farmers were encouraged to grow seasonal crops and vegetables which enabled them to produce food and cash crops. The farmers who grew vegetables and other cash crops as intercrops earned between Rs 35,000 and 40,000 in six months by selling their vegetables in the local market. A few farmers cultivated organic rice which is appreciable.

4. Livestock Development through promotion of Animal husbandry

Similarly, JSK also supported the farmers for livestock development. In 9 villages of Mandu Block, JSK helped 150 farmers with development of piggery and poultry. Poultry was supported to 100 farmers and piggery was supported to 50 tribal farmers. Total 150 farmers were increased their annual income by poultry and piggery activities.



5. Support to Physically Challenge People



During the last year, we provided specially designed motorcycle-scooty to 25 physically challenged persons including 6 females and 19 males. All are using Scooty smoothly for their daily purposes. They are maintaining the vehicle themselves. We followed to them. Our field social mobilizers always facilitate to them for getting income and ensuring livelihood. They are living with dignity and in an independent way. Their dependencies have been reduced. Organisation is continuously working on RPWD Act amended in the year 2016. Organization is facilitating and supporting in getting certificate, inrolling them for pension and other government facilities.

B. Education and Youth Empowerment

Elementary Education is fundamental right of a child belonging to the age group of 6 -14 but after 71 years of independence more than 30% children are still suffering from getting quality education due to different reasons. We are promoting education program by executing different activities.

Education is the processes of human development .It is the key of Life by which a man can survive easily but the condition of schooling in tribal areas of Jharkhand is severely neglected, with high rates of teacher lacking, poor pedagogical methods and low levels of learning among children. At the same time due to the lack of viable livelihoods requirement most of the guardians migrate to nearest town or cities for employment. Many children also migrate with their parents. Due to lack of engagement and skilled youths also migrate to the cities for livelihood.

1. School Development and Support



JSK education program provides support to Government Schools to make it a viable option for children to stay in school and control over the dropout rate. In this process, the organisation with support from Goonj, is working to make local schools more viable for children. In this, organisation works with children, community and teachers, sensitize them and work towards the development of school and nearby vicinity. In this process, the organisation has supported in form of distribution of school shoes to the children. Organization has covered total 5 schools. In Chatra dist. 02 schools where total 240 children were provided shoes in Katkamdag 02 schools

were covered with total 715 children and in Gomia block 01 school covering total 1525 children under shoes distribution programme. Goonj supported the shoes and organization distributed them to the children. Children felt very happy after getting the shoes.

Apart from shoe distribution with the support from Goonj, JSK provided CFW Kits and teaching and learning kits to the children in Gomia, Katkamsandi, Churchu and Simariya blocks.

The engagement with village community is primarily focusing to engage them for the development of school vicinity areas, like development of roads and other periphery.

The organisation has organised 7 awareness campaigns on Right to Education and tried to sensitized them on the importance of education issue among the children, youths and their parents. The campaign were organised in support with various donors, however, the purpose of this campaign was to aware the children and community on the importance of education. In geographic areas where JSK has been working, migration at early age is very common. Dropout from school due to various reasons is also quite common.

2. Youth Empowerment:

For promoting the games and sports among youths organisation, in support with ONGC, we provided Jersey to 120 clubs covering 1800 players. Organization has also provided one set of football to 120 teams for organizing village level and block level competition.

C. COMMUNITY HEALTH

1. Health, Sanitation and Drinking Water

The organisation has been working on sensitising the communities on the issues related to health and hygiene. In the geographic, where the organisation has been operational for years, has always tried to spread awareness on the issue of health.

During the year 2018-2019, organization has constructed one unit of toilets separately for boys and girls. 3 separate chambers were made separately for boys and girls in Upgraded high school Lawalong Kunda Panchayat in Gomia Block with the support from ONGC Bokaro.

Mother and Child Health & adolescent health within the project area are important focus of programmatic work even as the organization has been committed to providing community health services in the form of a referral services and periodic medical support.

RO water filters were provided to 14 schools in Gomiya block for safe drinking water under the support of ONGC ST/SC component plan. Selected govt schools got this facility. We selected ST schools as per govt mandate.

Construction of Jal Minars (water tank) having each capacity of 6000 ltr were constructed at Bagiatola and Sabditad at village - Hosir West. Total 1000 people are getting drinking water. Deep bore well were done by the organization. People are very much happy to get safe drinking water. earlier there was lack of drinking water in the village.



2. HIV and AIDS intervention with Female Sex Workers & Transit People



Organization has implemented the target intervention (TI) project at Garhwa district of Jharkhand with the support of JSACS govt of Jharkhand. Total target were 600 FSW and 10000 transit people in which we have covered 634 FSW and 1004 transit people. The Project found total 09 positive cases under the TI project. The project creates awareness about STI/HIV/AIDS among people and stake holders and develops understanding of safe sex among the stakeholders. The organisation work with FSWs. Referral services, regular counselling, linkages with ART Centres, training to ORW, road show etc were done during the year.

JSK organize the awareness campaign through organizing Canape at Railway station and provide counselling and fulfil the demand by distribution of condoms. JSK also organize the free medical check up camps for Sex workers on quarterly basis by the support of Prefer Public Providers and provided required medicine and counseling. JSK also refer to ART centre for positive sex worker for better treatment and enrolling for social security schemes.

3. Ambulance Services

The organisation is providing Ambulance services to the people of Mandu -Ramgarh district, Bishnugarh and Tatijhariya in Hazaribag and Gomiya block of Bokaro district. 10 cases from Mandu, 25 cases from Bishnugarh, 30 cases from Tatijhariya and total 55 cases from Gomia were provided medical van support with taking nominal fees. In case of health emergency, people are not access to any vehicle in the remotest villages of Bokaro and Hazaribagh Districts. As these villages are not only remote but also surrounded by dense forest areas. Private vehicle either avoid to go or they charge huge money. To avoid this situation during the health emergency, the organisation provides ambulance services to the poor and needy villagers. This service is a great assistance to the poor villagers especially at night. Death during pregnancy, antenatal death and post natal death is very common in Hazaribag. The villagers does not have any other option to reach hospital for treatment. Ambulance catering the need of pregnant women 24x7 to promote the institutional delivery also. Organization is very much thankful to MLA Mandu and MLA Gomiya to support this valuable work.

D. Domestic Violence and Women Empowerment

During the year organization has formed and strengthened 04 Kishori groups and 20 women Self Help Groups in Tatijharia Block. Sahiya , Anganwadi workers, PRI members, Local police station representatives were sensitised on these social issues. Regular meetings and counselling were done with victims and community as well. Organization is thankful to Srijan foundation Hazaribag for financial and technical support.

We are associated with **SAMMA & SWAYAM NETWORK** and **ASMITA NETWORK** for the purpose of minimizing domestic violence and gender discrimination

Women always play a key role in the family and society in creating livelihood activities. Keeping in view JSK organizes women from poor household to form self-help groups for saving and credit purposes. In most of the villages JSK begins work by promoting poor women's Self Help Groups, which is informal association

of 10 to 19 women to work together in a group. Under the Various project activities we have formed about 30 new SHGs during the year covering more than 450 members, Farm and nonfarm activities have been promoted among the SHG. They were trained on vermin compost, organic farming, goat rearing, Pig rearing and poultry farming.

While women in Jharkhand play a major role in livelihood activities such as agriculture, animal husbandry, collection of forest produce, wage labour and they enjoy certain rights not shared by women in other regions, such as choosing their partners and physical mobility, it is also true that most of these women are either illiterate or have low levels of education. Despite their role in earning their family's living, their position in society is weakened by lack of access to institutions such as the police and the legal system and the fact that they are unable to claim their rights and find it hard to know which institutions they can contact to address issues such as domestic violence and economic inequality. We are associating the SHG for other support agencies and Bank Linkages and work for Economic Empowerment.



E. Social Awareness

Awareness on Swachhata program.



Organisation has been continuously working for making ODF Village in its project area voluntarily without taking any financial grant from other agencies. We made awareness through campaigns and nukkad natak in the villages of Churchu Block.

Natural Resource Management and livelihood promotion is part of this thematic area, the group focuses on forming local Forest Protection Committees at community levels. These work for diversity, help in organising school programs for saving the environment and in water conservation.

Domestic violence is quite common in the tribal and rural villages in Jharkhand. Alcoholism, dowry etc were the key reasons for the same. With the help of Srijan Foundation, JSK is working for sensitisation on Domestic violence issues. It has helped to sort out 10 domestic violence cases.

The JSK volunteers works in close association with Srijan Foundation and supported in the formation of Mahila mandals, empower them on women related issues and build their capacities to resolve the domestic violence related at the spot. The volunteers are also working with 400 adolescents to build their understanding and capacities to deal and tackle with violence through different forms. Organization believes that discrimination of gender, education, rights and entitlements, participation in development processes, etc are the major issues taken by the organization for empowering on violence.

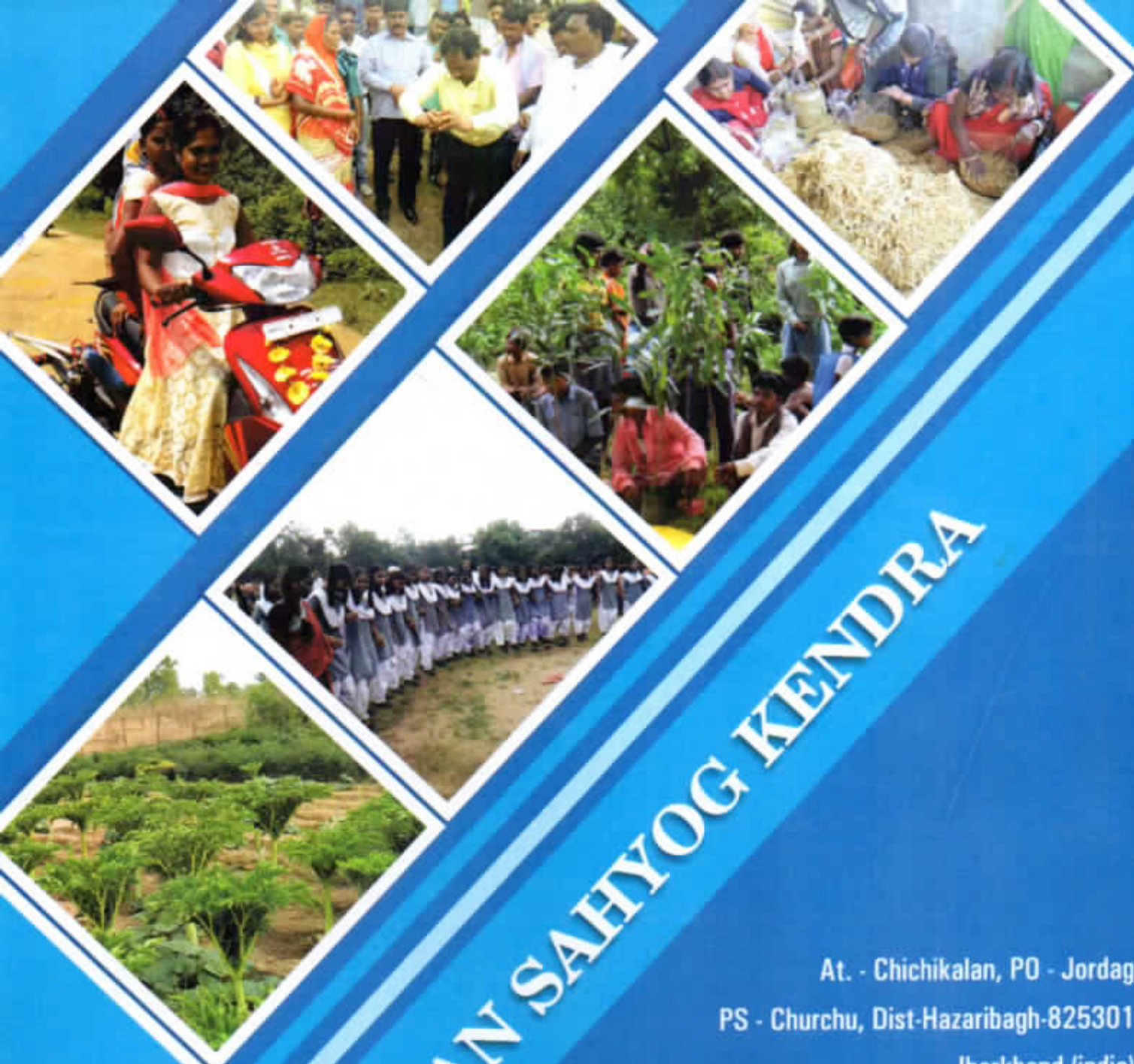
