From the desk of Secretary



We are happy to present our organizational annual report 2021-22. This year was very critical for all worldwide people due to highly effected by Covid -19. The Covid wave was very sensitive and affected the lifestyle of people. JSK tried their best to provide support to the needy people with their available resources.

This year our main focus was to provide the Covid relief to needy people and provide nutrition to the school children. We created awareness amongst the communities by sending precautionary messages, distributing grains, providing kits to the rural artisans for starting their livelihood, distributing fish spawn, duck chicks for additional income for families. We also arranged nutritional support for the children enrolled in A.W.W. JSK also constructed two classrooms in Upgraded Middle School, Siyari where children are studying with comfort.

We provided 50 women training on sewing and stitching for better livelihood and involved them in other income generating activities. This year we supported more than 600 farmers and provided the technical knowledge and support with an agriculture expert to increase the agricultural productivity. Female farmers prepared approximately 1,00,000 plant saplings in their poly-house. The distribution of plant saplings of vegetable crops greatly helped the farmers with less dispensable income to generate more profits. We also promoted fish production activities in 30 villages of Mandu, Tatijharia and Gomia blocks. More than 205 families are getting benefits from these fish production activities.

This year, we also supported women empowerment activities by promoting SHG groups and helped them link with bank for credit facilities. They are constantly saving money in groups and are actively taking loans from group as needed. We also helped some groups receive loans from banks.

All these programs have been possible due to regular and generous support from various donors, communities, government officers, CSR personnel, to whom I; on behalf of JSK, extend my heartfelt gratitude. The hard work, dedication and commitment of our project staff, volunteers and board members is greatly acknowledged.

ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

JAN SAYHOG KENDRA is a grass-root level non-profit and non-politically influenced organization, working in the field of development and mobilization of deprived communities who are struggling for their livelihood in the remote areas of Jharkhand since 2004. Since then, the organization is working with an approach towards integrated development of rural mass and creating awareness in the rural areas. The vision is to establish a self reliant, exploitation free, healthy and just society; where no one remains hungry, unemployed, illiterate and exploited. JSK believes that the elements of development and the resources required to develop a society lies in the society itself. The need is to identify them, mobilize them and facilitate them with opportunities to prosper. JSK also believes that peoples' participation, proper utilization of knowledge, skill and experiences of people are nevertheless important and valuable than modern knowledge.

Vision:

To establish a self-reliant, exploitation free, healthy and just society; where noone remains hungry, unemployed, illiterate and exploited.

Mission :

To organize and empower the under-privileged and marginal section of the rural society and take up developmental activities in a manner that will ensure higher participation of the rural poor and marginalized section in the national main stream of development.

OBJECTIVES

- ◆ To organize the village community and strengthen them in the capability of the group formed.
- ◆ To build up self confidence and self respect amongst the scattered group members.
- ◆ To promote a sense of belongingness among them.
- ◆ To promote social, economic and educational upliftment to the backward communities.
- ◆ To eradicate illiteracy.
- ◆ To promote saving and credit practices among the backward communities to promote income generation activities.
- ◆ To promote entrepreneurship development among villagers.
- ◆ To promote health and hygienic awareness.
- ◆ To promote awareness and importance of forest and wildlife.
- ◆ To promote pollution-free environment and green environment.
- ◆ To promote new agricultural practice.

STRATEGY

The Organization has adopted to balance the social action, mobilization and sustainable development program in order to ensure a just, educated, egalitarian and non-exploitative society. JSK mobilizes the rural folks and empowers them to promote development as a liberating force aimed at justice, economic growth and self-reliance.

Livelihood through Skill Development:

JSK organized the poor women and provided skill-training to the women of Mahuwatar village of Gomia block of Bokaro district on sewing and stitching for a better livelihood. The project was supported by ONGC Bokaro branch. A total of 50 women from different groups including ST- 23, SC-2, OBC-25 took training for a course of 6 months. They learnt 32 types of garments stitching with the help of this program. The women are using these sewing skills and are earning for their family. The average income of each family has increased by Rs. 3000-5000 monthly with the help of these activities.



Construction of additional classrooms in Middle School, Siyari :

By the support of ONGC Bokaro under Cooperate Social Responsibility, JSK constructed two additional classrooms in Upgraded Middle School, Siyari, Gomia , Bokaro. Before construction, the children were suffering and facing problem with sitting arrangements in the classroom. With the support of ONGC, the children can sit comfortably and receive education. The constructed classrooms have a dimension of 22' X 26' each. The children were ecstatic upon hearing this news and are attending the classes with joy.



Fish Farming :

Fish farming is an additional source of income for the villagers. ONGC Workers Women Samiti, Bokaro, supported the farmers of Gomia block in 9 selected ponds and provided them with fish spawn. It has become a good source of income for female farmers of the villages. Additionally, villagers benefitted from the monthly increase in thier income, along with incorporating nutrition from the fishes in their diet.



Support for Livelihood :

Under the program Vapasi of GOONJ, JSK supported 22 migrants who returned to their villages during Covid period along with people with disabilities and rural artisans of villages in starting their own small enterprises in their villages. Under these schemes, the project supported initiation of grocery stores, betel shop, saloon, hotel, chicken butchering centres, car painters, cobblers shop, etc. to increase their family income for a better livelihood. Everyone is running their businesses efficiently and are generating income for their family. It was a very wonderful experience working with them. All of them are doing exceptional and are not migrating for livelihood.





Under the support, 5 people received support for grocery shops, 2 people opted for betel shops, 3 people initiated their hotels, another started a mobile and electronics repairing shop, another opened a chicken butchering shop, 4 people started cobbler shops, 3 people started carpenter shops and 2 people started their saloons in their villages. Additionally, 10 people selected for Malhor artesian and 30 people for bamboo craft making goods. JSK supported them by providing the necessary raw materials.

The project also supported farmers with intervention area in which they provided them farming equipments. JSK distributed 5 Water Pumps and 2,000 feet of HDP pipe for irrigation purposes. Under the program, JSK provided fish spawn to 20 farm ponds in different villages.

In Baratad village of Gomia block, JSK supported the women in making poly houses (100' x 55') to prepare soilless plant saplings. These women are giving their contribution and preparing the vegetable plants. The other villagers are getting soilless sapling of plants from this nursery. Approximately, a total of 1,00,000 plant saplings were prepared and distributed among the farmers of nearest villages.

With the help of labour contributed by the villagers, many roads were repaired which in turn strengthened the farmers' bonds with nearby towns. JSK distributed blankets to 10 old people to protect them from the harsh winters.



DASRA

Community Health Program:

A lot of people were affected by Covid-19. It spread rapidly and with it spread the misconceptions about the covid -19 in the communities. During covid period, many migrant labourers came back to their villages but they were quarantined in village schools and community centres. Many voluntary organizations and NGOs extended their support to these people. JSK also actively participated in many relief works during the Covid period.

By the support of DASRA, JSK started a community health program in five villages namely Baratad, Pesra, Badkitad, Bhelwapani and Borwakocha. Under the program, the organization created awareness amongst communities and suggested people to keep maintaining social distancing. We also distributed medical kits (soap, thermometer, Oximeter, gloves, etc.) and sanitizers among villagers. JSK also painted walls in villages to promote awareness among the villagers.



Distribution of Dry Ration among the Needy People:

During covid , people were suffering from shortage of food grains. Also, people were not getting work during Covid period. Many migrant labourers returned to their villages. With the support of DASRA, JSK distributed food kits (50 Kg food grains to each family) among 162 needy families of Lodhi and Karikhurd Panchayats to ensure their food security for at least a month.

Duck Farming:

Many migrant labourers were searching for jobs in village areas during Covid period but it was not easily possible at the time. Thus, our project selected the farmers who had water availability in near their houses. JSK provided them with 10 duck chicks (Khakhi Cambel) each and thus, 50 families benefitted from this scheme. This particular species of duck was selected for its higher egg production capacity and as it provided more meat.

Support for Nutrition Among AWW Children:

Under the Milk Nutrition Support program supported by Jiv Daya Foundation, JSK selected 2 villages namely Badkitad and Borwakocha of Gomia block, Bokaro district where JSK arranged milk and biscuits for over 100 children (6 months to 5 years of age) on a daily basis. We regularly provided milk and biscuits to these children of AWW to improve their health and provide sustenance.

With the support of Jiv Daya Foundation, JSK also distributed 300 food kits among the villagers of 6 panchayats of Gomia block.

Ambulance Services

The organization provides Ambulance Services to the people of, Mandu - Rangarh district, Bishngarh and Tatijhariya in Hazaribag and Gomiya block of Bokaro district. 5 cases from Mandu, 8 cases from Bishnugarha, 12 cases from Tati Jhariya and a total of 10 cases from Gomiya were provided with medical van support at nominal charges. In case of a health emergency, people do not have access to any vehicle to the remote villages of Bokaro and Hazaribagh Districts. Since these villages are very remote and surrounded by forest areas, private vehicle either avoid going or they charge a huge fee. To avoid this situation, during a health emergency, the organization provides ambulance services to the poor and needy villagers. This service is of great assistance to





the poor villagers especially at night. Death during pregnancy, Antenatal death, and Post-natal death is very common in Hazaribag. The villagers do not have any other option to reach the hospital for their treatment. Our Ambulance Service is catering to the need of pregnant women 24x7 to promote antenatal awareness and ensure safe delivery of neonates also.

Domestic Violence and Women Empowerment

During this year, the organization has formed and strengthened 10 Kishori groups and 230 women Self Help Groups, in Tati Jhariya, Gomia, Bishnugarh, Mandu and Chatra Blocks. Sahiya, Anganwadi workers, PRI members, Local Police Station representatives were also sensitized on this social issue. Regular meetings and counseling were help with the victims and communities as well.

We are associated with **SAMMAANS SWAYAM NETWORK** and **ASMITA NETWORK** for the purpose of minimizing domestic violence and gender discrimination. The organization also distributed food kits among the needy people during Covid.

Women always play a key role in the family and society in creating livelihood activities. Keeping this in view, JSK organized women from poor household to form self-help groups for savings and credit purposes. In most of villages, JSK begins work by promoting poor women's Self Help Groups, which is an informal association of 12 to 19 women to work together in a group. Various project teams have been formed which in turn created 30 new SHGs during the year covering over 450 members. Farming and Non-farming activities have been promoted among the SHGs. They were trained on vermin compost, organic farming, goat rearing, pig rearing and poultry farming.

While women in Jharkhand play a major role in livelihood activities such as agriculture, animal husbandry, collection of forest produce and wage labour, and they enjoy certain rights not shared by women in other regions, such as choosing their partners and physical mobility, it is also true that most of these women are either illiterate or have low levels of education. Despite their role in earning their family's living, their position in society is weakened by lack of access to institutions such as the police and the legal system, and the fact that they are unable to claim their rights and find it hard to know which institutions they can contact to address issues like domestic violence and economic inequality. We are associating the SHGs with other support agencies and bank linking work for their Economic Empowerment.
