Secretary.....



It is a proud moment for us to present our annual report of Year 2022-23. We have officially achieved the milestone of 20 years in the field of Social Development. Our efforts have enabled us to accomplish the vision and mission of the organization. We spread our reach to various sectors including Women Empowerment, Children Education, Health Sector, Natural Resource Development, Water Sources etc. We tried our best to deliver optimum benefits to the targeted population. JSK believes in community participation and thus, involves the community in our work for complete community ownership.

This year our main focus was on improving the nutrition of children with the Milk Program. We are providing milk with biscuits to over 100 children on a regular basis. Additionally, we created awareness among communities about health and nutrition.

In our initiatives, we focus on creating awareness among rural communities of Tatijhariya and Bishnugarh blocks of Hazaribag district regarding Forest Rights. We support the villagers for their rights and how they can apply for getting legal land documents.

We also worked to develop infrastructure in villages to ensure comfortable accommodation and ease of life for the villagers. Numerous water structures were repaired and constructed in the reporting period. Goonj, New Delhi supported us in this program. JSK prepared over 2 lakh plants saplings and distributed them amongst the villagers to help them cultivate edible crops and sell them for monetary support, which ensured sustainable livelihood.

JSK made available; drinking water in Dhamdharwa village of Gomia block by constructing Jal Minar along with installation of solar motor. Over 250 villagers and children are getting safe drinking water from this water tank.

This year, we also supported Women Empowerment activities by promoting SHG groups in rural area. They constantly save money in the groups and take loans from the groups as per their need. We also helped some groups received loans from banks.

All these programs have been possible due to regular and generous support from our donors, communities, government officers, CSR personnel; to whom I, on behalf of JSK extend our heartfelt gratitude. The hard work, dedication and commitment of project staff, volunteers and board members are warmly acknowledged.

ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

JAN SAYHOG KENDRA is a grass-root level non-profit and non-politically influenced organization, working in the field of development and mobilization of deprived communities who are struggling for their livelihood in the remote areas of Jharkhand since 2004. Since then, the organization is working with an approach towards integrated development of rural mass and creating awareness in the rural areas. The vision is to establish a self reliant, exploitation free, healthy and just society; where no one remains hungry, unemployed, illiterate and exploited. JSK believes that the elements of development and the resources required to develop a society lies in the society itself. The need is to identify them, mobilize them and facilitate them with opportunities to prosper. JSK also believes that peoples' participation, proper utilization of knowledge, skill and experiences of people are nevertheless important and valuable than modern knowledge.

Vision:

To establish a self-reliant, exploitation free, healthy and just society; where noone remains hungry, unemployed, illiterate and exploited.

Mission :

To organize and empower the under-privileged and marginal section of the rural society and take up developmental activities in a manner that will ensure higher participation of the rural poor and marginalized section in the national main stream of development.

- ◆ To build up self confidence and self respect amongst the scattered group members.
- ◆ To promote a sense of belongingness among them.
- ◆ To promote social, economic and educational upliftment to the backward communities.

- ◆ To promote saving and credit practices among the backward communities to promote income generation activities.
- ◆ To promote entrepreneurship development among villagers.
- ◆ To promote health and hygienic awareness.
- ◆ To promote awareness and importance of forest and wildlife.
- ◆ To promote pollution-free environment and green environment.
- ◆ To promote new agricultural practice.

STRATEGY

The Organization has adopted to balance the social action, mobilization and sustainable development program in order to ensure a just, educated, egalitarian and non-exploitative society. JSK mobilizes the rural folks and empowers them to promote development as a liberating force aimed at justice, economic growth and self-reliance.

ONGC

Livelihood promotion through Agriculture Equipments:



JSK helps in promoting the livelihood through agriculture equipments in rural area. The farmers of Bhelwapani village of Gomia block were facing monetary issues in agriculture. They had land but due to lack of irrigation and technical knowledge, the farmers were

unable to generate enough food grain for their family. To earn livelihood, they would often migrate to cities. To resolve these issues, JSK provided drip irrigation and mulching systems among 22 farmers. This helped them cultivate 5 acres of land. This year they produced vegetables and

watermelon in bulk quantities. The farmers acquired new skills of farming and they are implementing these new ways of farming. Other farmers of this village also adopted these farming patterns and made their livelihood flourish.

Construction of Guard Wall:

The villagers of Padaria of Gomia block were facing problems in bathing and washing their clothes. There was high risk of children drowning during rainy season. JSK with the support of ONGC, constructed a guard wall and stairs on one end of pond. The guard wall helped reduce the soil erosion and the stairs enabled men and women to take bath and wash clothes more efficiently and with less risk of drowning.



Livestock Distribution:

Keeping livestock in rural area is one of the additional sources of livelihood in rural areas. By the support of ONGC Bokaro, JSK distributed 2 piglets to each family (TND) among 100 families of Gomia block. It is a good source to increase family income.



GOONJ

Distribution of Blankets:

JSK with support from GOONJ, distributed blankets amongst 100 old people. The old people were ecstatic and comfortable during the harsh winter.



Construction of Water Bodies by Labour Contribution:

With the support of GOONJ, the villagers contributed their labour and constructed many water structures to store water for multiple uses. These constructions include Bori Bandh (use of cement bag fill with sand) in Baratad, Earthen Checkdam in Navdanda, cleaning of wells in Dhodi, repairing roads in Navdanda, Farm Band in Kenduwa village, Chuwa (small place for water intake by

villagers) in Chilgo, Drainage in Sagunbeda in Gomia block of Bokaro district and creation of new ponds in Larkua villages of Chatra, district. The infrastructure have vastly helped the villagers who are using them to make their lives easier.



Seed Sapling Plant:

JSK constructed a Poly House (60'x50') in Baratad village of Gomia block in which over 100000 vegetable plants were prepared and distributed among the villagers. This support was given to villagers to help increase their productivity and income from agriculture. Now, there are over 250 small farmers who have benefitted from this nursery. They are growing vegetables and selling them in the local markets. JSK is also supporting farmers link with the markets to sell their produce.



Distribution of Seed Saplings:

With the support of ONGC, JSK distributed Seed Saplings among the farmers. Approximately 100000 plant saplings were prepared in the nursery and distributed among the villagers. It has promoted agriculture in this area. Farmers are happy to grow vegetables and make monetary gains by selling them. It has also helped women increase their family income.





Construction of Water Tank :

JSK constructed a water tank with the installation of Solar System Pump in Dhamdharwa village of Gomia block. The availability of water made lives of the villagers easier. Before this structure, the villagers used to traverse long distances to carry water from Chuwa. Now over 25 families of the village along with students are using this water.



Forest Rights:

JSK initiated creating awareness among tribal and indigenous communities on Forest Rights of Ttjihariya and Bishnugarh blocks of Hazaribag. It also supported increasing the livelihood among forest dwellers. It also helped in improving the lifestyle of people. Both blocks have lushly dense forest. We are working with a total of 1553 families from 10 villages



across both blocks. We are trying to spread awareness among people on forest rights and how they could use the forest produce to earn a livelihood.



Nutritional Support to Children:

With the support of Jiv Daya foundation, JSK provided milk and biscuits to 120 children of 2 AWW centers namely Borwakocha and Barkitad in Gomia blocks of Boakro district. Under the program, we included children of age 6 months to 5 years. This support is contributing in improving the health status of children. We also creating awareness among communities regarding health and nutrition of children.

Ambulance Services

The organization is providing Ambulance Services to the people of, Mandu block of Ramgarh

district, Bishnugarh and Tati Jhariya in Hazaribag and Gomiya block of Bokaro district. 8 cases from Mandu, 11 cases from Bishnugarh, 5 cases from Tati Jhariya and 2 cases from Gomiya were provided medical van support at nominal charges. In case of a health emergency, people do not have access to any vehicle for the remote villages of Bokaro and Hazaribagh Districts. As these villages are very remote and surrounded by dense forest areas, private vehicles either avoid going or they demand a huge amount. To avoid this situation, during a health emergency, the organization provides Ambulance Services to the poor and needy villagers. This service is of great assistance to the poor villagers especially at night. Death during pregnancy, antenatal deaths, and post natal deaths are very common in Hazaribag. The villagers do not have any other option to reach a hospital for their treatment. Our Ambulance Service is catering the need of pregnant women 24x7 to promote institutional delivery also. The organization is greatly indebted to MLA of Mandu and MLA of Gomiya for their support towards this valuable project.





Women Empowerment

During the year, the organization has formed and strengthened 20 Kishori group, 325 women Self Help Groups, in TatiJhariya Block. Sahiya, Anganwadi workers, PRI members, Local Police Station representatives were sensitized on these social issues. Regular meetings and counseling were done with the victims and communities as well.

We are associated with

SAMMA ANS SWAYAM NETWORK and ASMITA NETWORK for the purpose of minimizing domestic violence and gender discrimination

Women always play a key role in the family and society in creating livelihood activities. Keeping this in view, JSK organized women from poor household to form Self-

Help groups for savings and credit purposes. In most of villages, JSK begins work by promoting poor women's Self Help Groups, which is an informal association of 15 to 25 women to work together in a group. Various project teams have been formed which in turn created 45 new SHGs during the year covering over 650 members. Farming and Non-farming activities have been promoted among the SHGs. They were trained on vermin compost, organic farming, goat rearing, pig rearing and poultry farming.

While women in Jharkhand play a major role in livelihood activities such as agriculture, animal husbandry, collection of forest

produce and wage labour, and they enjoy certain rights not shared by women in other regions, such as choosing their partners and physical mobility, it is also true that most of these women are either illiterate or have low levels of education. Despite their role in earning their family's living, their position in society is weakened by lack of access to institutions such as the police and the legal system, and the fact that they are unable to claim their rights and find it hard to know which institutions they can contact to address issues like domestic violence and economic inequality. We are associating the SHGs with other support agencies and bank linking work for their Economic Empowerment.


